Each session will begin with a familiar Gospel reading, followed by the invitation to gaze on two separate pieces of art, one classical and one contemporary representation of the Gospel. While gazing at each piece, a slow series of prompts drawn from the ancient practice of Visio Divina will be offered to open our hearts to God's presence. The series, developed and presented by parishioners from the three Episcopal Churches in the Napa Valley, is open to our church families and friends.
